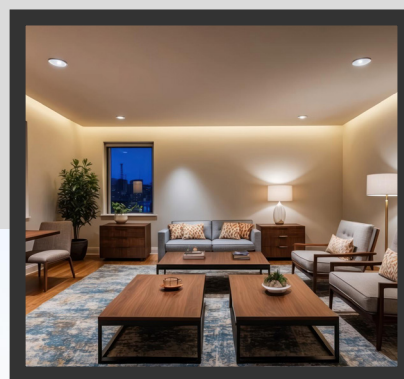

TO ASK

01

Licensing

Are you licensed, insured, and bonded?

02

Timeline

What is your estimated timeline for completing the work?

03

Who?

Who will do the work and what are their accreditations?

04

Payments

What are your payment terms and is a deposit required?

05

Guarantee

Do you offer any type of warranty or guarantee on your work?

06

Surprises

How do you handle unexpected issues or additional costs?

07

Estimates

Do you provide a written contract or detailed estimate?

BONUS

Scope of work

Not all estimates include the same scope of work so don't be afraid to ask questions to clarify exactly what's included.

HIRE A PRO

01

Codes

A pro knows codes & regulations- knows local building codes and if/ when permits are needed.

02

Tools

A pro has all the tools & equipment-arrive at your home equipped to do the work quickly and safely.

03

Safety

A pro will safely perform work to avoid potential risks to people or property.

04

Warranty

A pro offers a work-guarantee their service/work so if issues crop up after, they fix them.

05

Mistakes
